Over The Devil)

TO THE BIBLE *Colossians 1:12-13 KJV*

"Giving thanks unto the Father, which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light: Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son."

LET'S TALK



"From this moment forward, I declare that I enjoy peaceful and restful sleep, in the Name of Jesus. I cut off every attack of the enemy over my rest; nightmares have no place in my life," Jason boldly declared before settling in to sleep. He had struggled with recurring nightmares until he learned to exercise his authority in Christ over the devil.

Notice that our opening verse is written in the past tense. This means it's not just a promise; it's already happened! We've been qualified to be partakers in the inheritance of the saints in light, and the deliverance that the 13th verse speaks of is a completed action. God the Father made it happen. Hallelujah!

The term "power" used in the 13th verse is "Exousia" (Greek), and it translates to control or authority, highlighting that God has already transferred us out of the control and authority of darkness. You need not fear demons or be influenced by their actions. He's liberated you from the dominion, jurisdiction, influence and power of darkness. You have absolute dominion over them. It's important to

reflect on this truth.

Remember the words of Jesus, *“And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils...”* (Mark 16:17). Tell the devil off! Use the Name of Jesus against Satan and his cohorts of darkness. Stand firm on your identity in Christ; assert your authority and experience the transcendent life and liberty of the Spirit.



Go Deeper

2 Corinthians 2:14, James 1:22-25



Speak

I'm seated with Christ, far above all principality and power, where I reign over Satan and the powers of darkness. I live in the Word, not swayed by the lies, manipulations and tricks of the adversary. I walk on in victory, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

(You've Got Wealth Untold)

TO THE BIBLE *Ephesians 3:8 KJV*

"Unto me, who am less than the least of all saints, is this grace given, that I should preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ."

LET'S TALK



Isn't it amazing to know that you've got wealth untold? See how *The Amplified Bible* renders our opening verse: *"To me, though I am the very least of all saints (God's consecrated people), this grace (favor, privilege) was granted and graciously entrusted: to proclaim to the gentiles the unending (boundless, fathomless, incalculable, and exhaustless) riches of Christ [wealth which no human being could have searched out]."* Now, that's amazing!

When God speaks, His words are never exaggerated. He speaks absolute truth. So, if He says that in Christ Jesus we have unsearchable riches and wealth untold, then that's the reality. In Christ, you were born into unending, boundless, fathomless, incalculable and exhaustless riches—wealth, which no human being could have searched out. You better believe this. It's the reason Paul could boldly affirm in 1 Corinthians 3:21 that all things are yours. Your wealth is inestimable.

It doesn't matter where you're from, this is your heritage in Christ. Think like someone who's been born into *superabundance*—unlimited wealth and endless prosperity.

No matter who tries to cheat you or take from you, they can't touch the fullness of what you have. Think about it: how much water could anyone steal from the ocean? Not enough to leave it empty, right? That's the same with you. Nothing anyone does could leave you broke. That's why Jesus said if your neighbour borrows from you and doesn't pay it back, don't stress or chase them down. Why? Because your riches in Christ are *exhaustless*. Hallelujah!

TO THE BIBLE *Matthew 28:18 KJV*

"And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth"

LET'S TALK



The word translated "power" above is the Greek "Exousia," which means authority. In this profound statement, the Master wasn't just saying He has power; He was declaring His dominion, not just in heaven but here on earth too.

Consider this: if the Lord Jesus has all authority on earth, that means every nation, government, and leader is under His authority. That's why the Bible says He is seated in heavenly places, *"high above all other government and authority and power and dominion, and every title of sovereignty, now and forever"* (Ephesians 1:21 WNT).

Now, here's the best part—all of this authority is for our benefit! The CEV Translation says, *"Christ rules over all forces, authorities, powers, and rulers...God has put all things under the power of Christ, and for the good of the Church he has made him the head of everything"* (Ephesians 1:21-22 CEV). How wonderful is that!

Right after He declared in Matthew 28:18 that all authority was given to Him in heaven and on earth, the Lord gave us a mission. He said, *"Go therefore, and teach all nations..."* (Matthew 28:19). He sent us to take His message to the nations, backed by His authority. Now you can see why

no government, kingdom, tyrant, or dictator has ever been able to destroy the Church. This is why they've all failed and always will. There's only One with authority over everything in heaven and on earth, and His Name is Jesus!

The Bible says He's *"in charge of running the universe, everything from galaxies to governments. No name and no power is exempt from His rule. And not just for now, but forever. He is in charge of it all and has the final word on everything..."* (Ephesians 1:21-22 MSG). Hallelujah!

REJECT LUKEWARMNESS

(Refuse To Be Ineffective in
The Things of God)

TO THE BIBLE Revelation 3:16 NKJV

"So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth."

LET'S TALK



Many read today's opening verse and wrongly assume the words were addressed to sinners. The Lord Jesus was actually speaking to Christians in the Laodicean church who had become lukewarm. In other words, they had become unenthusiastic, unprofitable, or ineffective in their faith.

A Christian who is lukewarm is an unprofitable servant. In Matthew 25, the Lord Jesus told a story about a servant who did nothing with the money his master gave him. He was called *unprofitable* because he didn't use what he was given. The parable starts with, *"For the kingdom of heaven is like a man..."* (Matthew 25:14), letting us know that this unprofitable servant was someone already in the Kingdom of Heaven. The reason he was termed unprofitable was because he didn't do anything with what he had.

In verse 30, we see the fate of the unprofitable servant: *"...cast the unprofitable servant into outer darkness: there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."* Pretty harsh, right? Well, the message is clear: being lukewarm is absolutely unacceptable! The good news is, if you've been lukewarm, you can change. The Lord Jesus says, *"As many as*

I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent"
(Revelation 3:19).

If you've been going through the motions or have been ineffective, it's time to repent and get back to being on fire for God. The Holy Spirit came to stir you up for service and to make you fruitful, profitable, efficient and effective. Glory to God!

TO THE BIBLE *Proverbs 2:6 NLT*

"For the Lord grants wisdom! From his mouth come knowledge and understanding."

LET'S TALK



In Proverbs 4:8, the Bible says, *"Exalt her, and she shall promote thee: she shall bring thee to honour, when thou dost embrace her."* Wisdom is key. And God's Word is God's wisdom. When the Bible speaks to you, it's wisdom talking directly to you in that moment.

The Scriptures tell us that wisdom cries out in the streets, but sadly, many ignore it (Proverbs 1:20-25). That's why there are so many struggling today. Wisdom says, *"Riches and honour are with me; durable riches and righteousness. My fruit is better than gold, and my revenue better than silver. I lead in the way of righteousness... I will cause those who love me to inherit substance and fill their treasures"* (Proverbs 8:18-21).

This is why you need to pay attention to God's Word because it's wisdom speaking! Let the Word of God dwell in you richly in all wisdom (Colossians 3:16). Riches and honour—durable riches and righteousness—are in the Word of God (the Wisdom of God). So, always act on it.

Become wisdom-conscious, and He'll show you visions of the steps you should take to multiply your resources even as a young person. Wisdom makes you creative and innovative. Proverbs 8:12 says, *"I wisdom dwell with prudence, and find out knowledge of witty*

inventions.” Wisdom will give you ideas that set you apart.

Also, learn to speak wisdom. The Bible says, *“Howbeit we speak wisdom among them that are perfect..”* (1 Corinthians 2:6). Speaking wisdom is speaking the Word; it’s speaking in agreement with God.

THERE'S A LIFTING FOR YOU

(Refuse To Join The
Complainers)

TO THE BIBLE *Job 22:29 KJV*

"When men are cast down, then thou shalt say, There is lifting up; and he shall save the humble person."

LET'S TALK

"I don't know what's going on. It feels like everything in my life is just falling apart. Everywhere I look, it's just bad news," Ethan sighed as he slumped on his friend Liam's bed.

Liam glanced up from his desk, his voice steady and calm. "Don't start thinking like that, Ethan. You're not like everyone else. You're a child of God."

"Do you really think so?" Ethan asked, his tone uncertain.

"I don't just think so; I know so," Liam responded firmly. "You play by a different set of rules. Always remember that."

Ethan's situation might feel familiar. Sometimes, life throws so much negativity your way that it's hard to see past it. But what Liam said is exactly how you should think: you're not like everyone else. The Bible says, *"When men are cast down, then thou shalt say, There is lifting up..."* (Job 22:29). Instead of giving in to the negativity, you should declare boldly, "There's lifting up for me!"

But what does that really mean? To say "There's lifting up" is to declare that God's power is at work in your life to elevate you no matter what's going on around you. It's about rising above challenges, being promoted, and seeing blockages removed.

Maybe something has been weighing you down, or you feel stuck in a situation, or you're waiting on a promotion or opportunity that seems elusive. Remember what the Bible says: *"For promotion cometh neither from the east, nor from the west, nor from the south. But God is*

the judge..." (Psalm 75:6-7). Promotion comes from God! So, instead of focusing on the problem, focus on the One who lifts you up.

Even if you've made mistakes, it's not the end of your story. If you feel like you're in a mess of your own making, don't let guilt keep you there. The Bible says God lifts the poor from the dust and the beggar from the ash heap to set them among princes (1 Samuel 2:8). He doesn't just pull you out—He places you in positions of honor and glory. No matter what's happening, lift your hands to heaven and declare: "There's lifting up for me!" Glory, Hallelujah!

TO THE BIBLE Romans 5:17 KJV

"For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ."

LET'S TALK



I love what Paul says in Philippians 3:8-9 about this glorious righteousness we have by faith in Jesus Christ. He says, "...that I may win Christ, and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith." When you accepted Jesus as Lord, His righteousness was imparted to you. And guess what? Christ's righteousness is perfect; it doesn't need any improvement! Nothing you do today can make you more righteous or less righteous before God. When He looks at you, He sees the righteousness of Christ.

Jesus was sinless, the only one qualified to be our substitute, and He gave you His righteousness. God accepted His qualification on your behalf. So, you're no longer relying on your own efforts; you live by the righteousness of Jesus Christ.

Romans 5:1 says, "Therefore, being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Being "justified" means you're cleared of all guilt by your faith in Jesus, as if you never sinned. Now you have peace with God through Jesus!

Unfortunately, some Christians still struggle to attain righteousness. But we couldn't attain righteousness ourselves, so God gave us His. You're just as righteous as Jesus is because He substituted His righteousness for your sin-nature when you confessed Him Lord of your life. Isn't that amazing? Praise God!

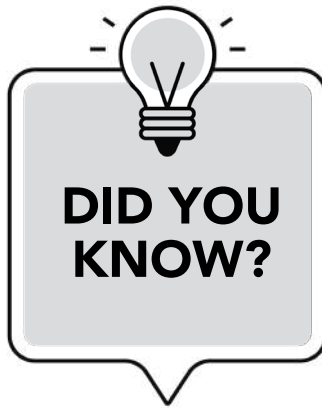

BIBLICAL MISCONCEPTIONS AND THE TRUTH

Throughout history, many popular stories and teachings from the Bible have been passed down with certain details that are not entirely accurate. These misconceptions often arise from cultural interpretations, artistic representations, or misquotes that have taken on a life of their own. While these ideas can shape our understanding, it's important to revisit the source—Scripture itself—to discover the full and accurate meaning. Let's begin by exploring a few misconceptions that have been widely circulated about biblical events and figures, clarifying the actual teachings of Scripture.

1. The forbidden fruit in the Garden of Eden was an apple.

Truth: The Bible does not specify the type of fruit. Genesis 3 simply refers to it as "the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil." The idea of an apple likely arose from artistic interpretations and a Latin pun on "malum" (evil) and "malus" (apple).

2. There were three wise men who visited Jesus.

Truth: The Bible (Matthew 2:1-12) does not specify the number of wise men—only that they brought three gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The number three is inferred but not explicitly stated.

3. Noah took two of every animal onto the ark.

Truth: While Noah took two of every unclean animal, he took seven pairs of every clean animal (Genesis 7:2-3).

4. The Bible says God works in mysterious ways.

Truth: This phrase is not in the Bible. It originates from a hymn written by William Cowper in 1774. The Bible does emphasize God's wisdom beyond human understanding (Isaiah 55:8-9).

5. The devil rules hell.

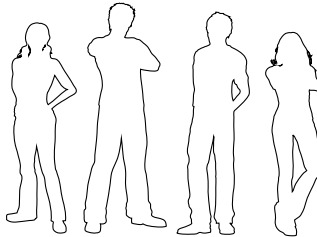
Truth: The Bible describes Satan as the "prince of the power of the air" (Ephesians 2:2), roaming the earth (Job 1:7, 1 Peter 5:8). Hell is described as a place of punishment created for the devil and his angels (Matthew 25:41). He doesn't rule it; he will be cast into it (Revelation 20:10).

6. Jesus didn't have a house while on earth.

Truth: While the Lord Jesus lived a life of humility and travel, He did have a place to stay at times. In Matthew 9:27-30, He led two blind men to a house, suggesting He had a home during His ministry. His statement in Matthew 8:20 about having "nowhere to lay His head" reflects His transient lifestyle, not complete homelessness.

7. Cleanliness is next to godliness.

Truth: This phrase is not found in the Bible. It was popularized by John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, in the 18th century. The Bible does emphasize spiritual cleanliness and purity (2 Corinthians 7:1) but not in this phrase.





BE SPIRITUALLY ALERT

(We Are In An Ongoing
Fight)

TO THE BIBLE *Romans 8:6 KJV*

"For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace."

LET'S TALK



As Christians, it's crucial that we stay spiritually alert because we're soldiers in God's army, and we're engaged in spiritual warfare. Ephesians 6:12 reminds us that *"..we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places."*

2 Corinthians 10:4 also tells us, *"The weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds."* Though the fight is ongoing, we aren't told when each battle will happen, but God wants us prepared at all times. He lets us know that there are "evil days" (Ephesians 6:13), and this signifies "battle days." A battle is the actual fight of a war. To be ready, we must stay spiritually attuned, sensitive to the Spirit and ready for His guidance.

We have an adversary—Satan—who doesn't rest. 1 Peter 5:8-9 warns us, *"Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour. Whom resist steadfast in the faith..."* And in Ephesians 6:10-11, we're told to *"be strong in the Lord, and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil."*

You have dominion and authority over principalities, powers, the rulers of the darkness of this world, and spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Use the spiritual weapons listed in Ephesians 6:14-18 to frustrate their stratagems and foil all their evil works. Hallelujah!

TO THE BIBLE Luke 21:25-26 KJV

"And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring; Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken."

LET'S TALK



There are so many signs showing us where we are today and how close the world is to facing judgment. No matter where you are or what you're doing, one thing is clear: Jesus is coming soon.

Some people believe it and are waiting for Him, while others don't think He's coming and live like it doesn't matter. But the truth is that He is coming, and very soon too! The Bible says He's coming for those *"that love his appearing"* (2 Timothy 4:8), those who are ready and excited to meet Him. Luke 12:37 says blessed are those who are waiting for His return. So, live every day like it could happen any minute! The Bible even says, *"In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump... the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed"* (1 Corinthians 15:52).

It's been roughly two thousand years since Jesus ascended into Heaven, and everything the prophets said about His return is being fulfilled. Jesus Himself said, *"Surely I come quickly"* (Revelation 22:20). The world today is filled with the worst violence, cruelty, and inhumanity ever known to man, and the pressures of life are far greater today than ever before. Therefore, don't be caught off guard. Stay in Christ and live in His righteousness. Let your light shine ever so brightly in a dark and crooked world. Philippians 2:15-16 (NIV) charges us to be *"...blameless and harmless, children*

of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast the word of life..."

Make it your mission to share the Gospel with your time, energy, and resources, reaching as many people as possible. Begin the countdown from now and start living in expectation of the Lord's return. Prepare yourself and prepare others because the Lord is coming soon!



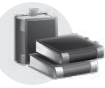

LET'S TALK

"**T**oday, I declare that my life is excellent and full of glory! I live in divine health, strength, and prosperity. I walk in victory, joy, and abundance every day because I am in Christ Jesus!" Casey declared confidently as she got ready for class that morning.

It's so important that you make faith-filled declarations like this about your life every day. Speak God's Word over yourself because what you declare in faith becomes your reality. If you don't say it, you can't have it.

Think of your words like seeds. If a farmer doesn't plant the right seeds in his field, weeds will grow instead. The same applies to your life. If you don't continually affirm divine health and blessings, negativity will creep in. Refuse to allow any sickness, disease or infirmity into your life. Declare that it has no power over your body. Glory to God!

God has already given you a transcendent life—a life of mastery, dominion, and victory. He said to Abraham, *"I have made you a father of many nations"* (Romans 4:17 NKJV). Notice He didn't say, "I will make you..." He calls things that are not as though they were. And the same God says to you, "I have made you a success. I have made you healthy and strong. I have made you prosperous. I have made you a king-priest."

Align yourself with this truth! Call yourself what God has called you. Speak the same words in agreement with Him. The Bible says against hope, Abraham believed in hope. He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief but was strong in faith, giving glory to God. He introduced himself as "Abraham, the father of many," because he believed what God said. His faith-filled declarations brought the promise to life, leading to the birth of Isaac. Be like Abraham. Believe, speak, and watch your faith-filled words create the life you desire. Blessed be God!

TO THE BIBLE *Psalm 110:1-2 KJV*

"The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool. The Lord shall send the rod of thy strength out of Zion; rule thou in the midst of thine enemies..."

LET'S TALK

"**R**adah," the Hebrew word translated "rule" in Psalm 110:2, essentially means "reign." To rule therefore mean to exercise dominion and kingly authority. The opening scripture highlights Jesus' authority as our High Priest in heaven, from where He reigns with power and authority.

For example, the phrase "the rod of thy strength" refers to the sceptre of His power—His kingly rule. Psalm 45:6 (NIV) says, *"Your throne, O God, will last for ever and ever; a scepter of justice will be the scepter of your kingdom."* Hebrews 1:8 reinforces this, declaring, *"But unto the Son he saith, Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever: a sceptre of righteousness is the sceptre of thy kingdom."*

But here's the exciting part: this authority isn't just the Lord's; it's our as well! Revelation 5:10 tells us, *"And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth."* As new creations in Christ, we are kings and priests called to reign in life.

How do kings reign? With words! In Genesis, God created the universe by speaking. He said, "Let there be light," and there was light. The Lord Jesus also demonstrated

the same power when He walked the earth. He spoke words that healed the sick, raised the dead, and transformed lives.

As believers, we carry the same authority. 1 John 4:17 reminds us, *"As He is, so are we in this world."* Your words have power. Use them to speak life, create change, and exercise your God-given authority.

Reign with your words. Rule over challenges, fears, and obstacles by declaring victory. Speak boldly, knowing that the authority of Christ is in you.

LET'S TALK

Our opening verse reminds us that God is able to direct toward you all the grace you need to live an excellent and impactful life. James 4:6 says *"...He gives more grace..."* This means He equips you with the skills, abilities, and strength you need to succeed. How inspiring that is!

Think about what the Apostle Paul said in 2 Corinthians 3:5 (AMPC): *"Not that we are fit (qualified and sufficient in ability) of ourselves...but our power and ability and sufficiency are from God."* That's the life God has given you! He's made you capable, efficient, and capable of every good work.

This truth should give you a mindset of endless possibilities. You're graced to excel in everything—your studies, hobbies, and daily goals. When challenges come, you can confidently say, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13).

Whenever you're given a task or an opportunity, know that you're equipped to succeed. You make great things happen because God has specially graced you to produce excellence. Psalm 1:3 (NKJV) describes you perfectly: *"He shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that brings*

forth its fruit in its season, whose leaf also shall not wither; and whatever he does shall prosper."

So, live with the confidence that you were created and graced to excel. Colossians 1:10 says, *"...walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work, and growing in the knowledge of God."* This is your reality! Hallelujah!

LET'S TALK

In Matthew 5:14 (NKJV), the Lord Jesus said, *"You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden."* This powerful statement reminds us of our purpose in the world. Similarly, in Isaiah 60:2, the prophet foretold, *"For behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and deep darkness the people; but the LORD will arise over you, and His glory will be seen upon you."*

In Christ Jesus, the glory of the Lord is resident in us so much so that the Word declares that we are His glory! We're called to be the light that shines in a dark and cynical world. No matter the darkness and problems in the world, you're the hope and solution the world needs. That's a big deal!

The Lord Jesus said in John 9:5, *"As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world."* And 1 John 4:17 tells us, *"... as He is, so are we in this world."* This means the challenges you see in the world today are your opportunities to shine and make a difference. You're here to bring direction and hope to others.

Light stands out—it shows the way. You're here to show the world how to live with purpose and succeed despite obstacles. In John 8:12, Jesus said, *"I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but*

have the light of life." Now that light is in you!

Think about Isaiah 9:2, it says, *"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light."* That's you—they see God's light through you. Your ministry is to turn people from darkness to light, from the power of Satan to God (Acts 26:18). The light of God's righteousness is the greatest light, and you're the one carrying it. So go out boldly and share the Gospel wherever you are. Shine His light for everyone to see! Praise God!

LET'S TALK



Think about how much the Father loves us—it's incredible! In 2 Corinthians 5:19, the Bible says, "God was in Christ, reconciling the world to Himself, not counting people's sins against them." That's amazing! But not everyone likes hearing about this love. Some people think teaching about God's love and forgiveness gives others an excuse to sin. But that's not true at all!

Here's the truth: the more you learn about God's love, the more you love Him. And when you love someone deeply, you don't want to hurt or offend them. Romans 2:4 reminds us, "It's the goodness of God that leads us to repentance." It's not fear or judgment that draws us to Him—it's His kindness and love.

God's love doesn't give us permission to sin; instead, it inspires us to love Him in return by living for Him. Romans 6:1-2 puts it perfectly: "Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid!" When you truly understand how much God loves you, you naturally want to live in a way that honors Him.

Jeremiah 31:3 says, "I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore, with lovingkindness I have drawn you." That everlasting love draws us closer to God, and because we love Him, we keep His Word; we do what He wants. The Lord Jesus said, "If you love Me, keep My

commandments" (John 14:15).

No one gets to truly know Jesus, how loving He is, without loving Him. The Bible says we know He loves us from the message He sent to us, and we received that message and came into fellowship with Him. Now that you're in fellowship with Him, all you want to do is to walk worthy of Him, pleasing Him in all things. His love changes everything!

LET'S TALK

"Hey, Ryan, did you end up applying to Hillcrest Ivy? Everyone seems to be going there—it's like the only college anyone's talking about," Jake asked, leaning against the cafeteria table with curiosity in his voice.

Ryan shook his head, a calm resolve in his expression. "Nah, Jake. I prayed about it, and Hillcrest isn't where God wants me to be."

Jake frowned, puzzled. "Wait, what? Everyone says it's the best place to go. Don't you think you'll miss out?"

Ryan smiled. "I get it, but I'm not everyone. I've learned that God's plan for me is unique. Just because it's popular doesn't mean it's His will for my life."

Ryan's response highlights an important truth: your life is designed to follow God's perfect will, not the expectations or trends of others. The Bible says, *"Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will"* (Romans 12:2).

When you align your decisions with God's Word, you step into His preordained path for you. Many people end up frustrated because they take jobs, pursue relationships, or make decisions without seeking His will. That's why it's crucial to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit. The Bible says

in Romans 8:14, *“For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.”*

Before making major decisions, take time to meditate on the Word and pray. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you. When you do this, He brings clarity and lights your path, helping you discern His exact plan. Imagine the peace of knowing every step you take is God’s perfect design for your life.

So, whether it’s choosing a school, career, or even your daily interactions, remember that nothing about your life should be outside of God’s purpose. Follow His lead, and you’ll not only walk in His perfect will but also fulfill your destiny in Him. Like Ryan, choose what God wants for you—not what’s popular or expected. It’s the key to living a life of purpose.

Every child of God is born into an amazing inheritance in Christ—one that is exhaustless. The Apostle Paul refers to it as "unsearchable riches" (Ephesians 3:8 AMPC), meaning wealth so vast it's beyond understanding. This is your reality in Christ!

So, why do some Christians still struggle when God has already blessed them with such abundance? The answer lies in the ignorance of God's truth. God said in Hosea 4:6, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge." Many simply don't know what belongs to them.

That's why the Apostle Paul said in Acts 20:32, "I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among those who are sanctified." "Facts are one thing," Alex said, "but your words shape your reality. You become what you speak, think, and believe."

Your life is the outworking of all you've imbibed in words; your life is a product of words. Human beings were created with words. The physical body was formed from the dust of the ground but the human person—the real you, which is your spirit—was created with words. To be born again, a man is recreated with words (Romans 10:9-10). Words are so important. As a matter of fact, words are everything. They're the most potent and important things in the earth. Think about it: the whole universe was created with words.

"And God is able to make all grace (every favor and earthly blessing) come to you in abundance, so that you may always and under all circumstances and whatever the need be self-sufficient [possessing enough to require no aid or support and furnished in abundance for every good work and charitable donation]"

LET'S TALK

I've searched the Scriptures and I find no place where it gives us the idea that poverty, lack and want might be God's will; there isn't even a suggestion of that in the Bible. Recall that even the devil blamed God for making Job rich and blessing him with great substance (Job 1:9-10). It brings to mind the words of David in Psalm 23:1-2, "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures...." That's the way to think. You're plugged into an unending supply. This has nothing to do with the country where you live; it's the life you've been called to in Christ Jesus. I know sometimes you hear people around complain bitterly about the situation of the country or blame the country for any hindrance or inconvenience; recall again what we read in our opening scripture. God doesn't want you conscious of need. You're an heir of God and a joint-heir with Christ (Romans 8:17). 1 Corinthians 3:21 says, "...all things are yours." Your heavenly Father owns the whole world and has willed it to you because you're Abraham's seed: *"And if ye be Christ's, then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise"* (Galatians 3:29). So don't think or complain like them; instead, call forth your riches. You have to embrace the reality that your financial or material prosperity is important to God. He said in 3 John 1:2, "Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest

prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth." Think about that! Then Job 22:24-25 says, "Then shalt thou lay up gold as dust...and thou shalt have plenty of silver." If you ever wiped a table clean of dust, you'd observe that after a while, dust settled again on the surface. It paints a picture of the kind of prosperity God's people are called to experience—an unending and abundant supply.

Choose the joyful, prosperous life in Christ. Don't see your parents as your source of livelihood but as a medium to bless others. In Christ, you've been brought into the life of superabundance; acknowledge and enjoy your inheritance.

LET'S TALK

Christianity begins with the resurrection of Jesus Christ, not the death. This doesn't mean the death of Jesus Christ is not important, for there would be no resurrection if there were no death. If you believe in the resurrection, you definitely believe in the death, but the key is in believing in the resurrection. That's what gave us a new life.

In Acts 13:33, the Bible says, "God hath fulfilled the same unto us their children, in that he hath raised up Jesus again; as it is also written in the second psalm, "Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee." This isn't referring to His birth in Bethlehem but the rebirth at the resurrection.

Jesus was the first begotten of the dead, which means the first to be born out of spiritual death. On the cross, He died two deaths. He died spiritually first when our sins were laid on Him and He was cut off, separated from the Father. He cried out on the cross, "My God, my God, why has thou forsaken me" (Mark 15:34). When that happened, it became possible for Jesus to die physically.

When He died, He went to hell in the spirit because that's where we all should have gone; He went to hell in our place. But He was a righteous man, bearing the sins of others. The Bible shows us how in hell, Satan and all the demons of darkness grappled with Jesus in order to subdue Him. But He threw off from Himself principalities and powers and made a public spectacle of them (Colossians 2:15).

Jesus publicly defeated Satan and the demons of

darkness and came out of death and hell in victory. When He arose, the Bible says He was justified; the resurrection was the sign. That rebirth at the resurrection meant that there was no sin, there was no condemnation; the debt of sin was paid by His death, but His resurrection of a new life brought us justification (Romans 4:25).

That's why today, anyone who believes that Jesus died for their sins and was raised back to life for their justification comes into a newness of life and becomes a new creature: "Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4).

LET'S TALK

The Church has its systems, structures and principles. Except we understand them, many could live amiss and think they're doing right just because they feel good about their actions. That you feel good or are at peace about something doesn't make it acceptable to God. Imagine you're working on a school project. You pour hours into it, making it look amazing, but you completely ignore the teacher's instructions. On submission day, you're disappointed to get a bad grade because you did what felt right to you, not what was asked. The Spirit of God inside you will always bear witness with His Word as He guides you from within. He said in Isaiah 30.21, "And thine ears shall hear a word behind thee, saying, this is the way, walk ye in it." God's Word helps you know what God wants. Remember something that happened in the book of Genesis: Cain chose to bring to God an offering that he decided by himself. But Abel, on the other hand, brought to God an offering in accordance with God's will. He followed God's instructions.

Cain's offering was rejected, while Abel's offering was accepted. This shows how much God cares about how things are done for Him and towards Him. Don't find out late in life that you were living the wrong way or that all you were doing was rejected by God. How can you know that you're pleasing Him or that what you're doing is right? It's

through the Scriptures.

The Word of God is clear as to how we must live; it's your perfect guide. The Psalmist said, *"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path"* (Psalm 119:105). Recall the words of the Master in John 8:12: *"...I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life."* How do you follow Him?

It's through the Word, by the Word, and in the Word. Follow the Word and you'll not make errors, for those who err, according to the words of Jesus in Matthew 22:29, do so because they don't know the Scriptures: *"...Ye do err, not knowing the scriptures...."*

"Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy." Proverbs 31:8-9 (NIV)

The word "activism" originates from the Latin *actus*, meaning "a doing or driving force." The modern term emerged in the early 20th century from the German *Aktivismus*, referring to deliberate action for social or political change. Activism involves intentional efforts to address injustices and advocate for moral principles through protests, advocacy, or community service.

The Bible presents numerous examples of activism. Moses led the Israelites out of Egyptian slavery, confronting Pharaoh in pursuit of justice (Exodus 3-14). The prophets, including Isaiah and Amos, spoke boldly against corruption, urging people to seek justice and defend the oppressed (Isaiah 1:17). Jesus Himself was an activist, challenging religious hypocrisy, healing the marginalized, and proclaiming freedom for the oppressed (Luke 4:18-19). The apostles continued this mission, fearlessly spreading the gospel despite persecution (Acts 5:29).

Christian activism is not rebellion but a call to action, standing for truth, justice, and righteousness. Just as biblical figures took bold steps for God's purposes, Christians today must engage actively in transforming their world through faith-driven action, ensuring the continued spread of the gospel in a broken world.

LET'S TALK



The word "Church" in the New Testament really means "the called out ones"; it's from the Greek "Ecclesia" (a calling out). And when we say we're God's called-out ones, it doesn't refer to being called out of the world unto God. What actually happens is that we're called out from home to service. We find this captured in Hebrews 13:13, which says, "Let us go forth therefore unto him without the camp, bearing his reproach." Mark the expression "without the camp"; it means outside the camp. We're the called-out ones to serve Him outside the camp. It mirrors what the Bible says, that Jesus Christ was crucified outside the city gates. So, He says let us also go forth therefore unto Him outside the camp, bearing His reproach. It's about our work of service, our evangelical work to the whole world. The ensuing verse 14 clarifies it some more; it says, "For here have we no continuing city, but we seek one to come." In other words, get to work, do His work.

When we gather as the Church, it's for a purpose; we come to praise Him for the purpose of going to do what He told us to do. He said: "...Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 1 6:15). The real work is

outside the camp. We've been sent to spread the news of His saving power to the ends of the earth.

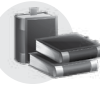

The Bible tells us that Jesus is the image (icon) of the invisible God (2 Corinthians 4:4 , Colossians 1:1 5). That means He's the resemblance and visual representation of God, the profile of God. If you want to know what God looks like, Jesus is the profile; He has all the characteristics, descriptions and attributes of Deity. In your environment you should be the profile of the Father, always representing Him in everything you do and say.

Hebrews 1:3 says Jesus is the brightness of God's glory and the "express image" of His person. Here, "charakter" (Greek) is used for express image; and it means the facsimile or print copy. Jesus is the facsimile or print copy of God. This is amazing!

The Bible says in Jesus dwells the fullness of the Godhead bodily (Colossians 2:9). It pleased the Father that in Him (Jesus) should all fullness dwell (Colossians 1:19). No wonder He said in John 10:30, "I and my Father are one."

When you see Jesus, you won't need to look for the Father and the Holy Spirit. Jesus is the perfect appearance and replica of the Godhead. He's the expression of God's glory, honour and majesty. Blessed be His Name forever!

LET'S TALK



There's no specific calling or unique gift among Christians that's exclusively for casting out demons. Nowhere in the Bible is such a gift mentioned. Rather, what the Bible says is that every Christian, without exception, has the authority and ability to cast out demons. This truth is firmly established in the words of Jesus: *"And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils..."* (Mark 1 6:17). Our dominion and superiority over Satan is simply because of who we are in Christ and the power of attorney He's given to us to use His Name. So, the idea of needing someone to pray a "powerful prayer" for you to cast the devil out is unnecessary. What you simply need is the recognition of the power in the Name of Jesus and to use it to subdue demons.

We're not under the jurisdiction of Satan. This truth should be evident in your life; live free from the encumbrances of the enemy. Your life can be as glorious as you desire it to be; you have the authority to make it happen. There's no need to implore God to deal with the devil for you because He has already executed the full victory over the enemy long before you came on the scene. Almost two

thousand years ago, Jesus decisively dealt with the devil.

And guess what? When Jesus defeated them, you were in Him. In Christ, you defeated Satan and the principalities of darkness. It's the reason you're superior to them and can reign and rule over them. Hallelujah!

Mary sat with her friend Lisa, as they discussed their faith.

"You know, I've been trying to live like Jesus," Mary said, "but sometimes it's so hard to love those who hurt me."

Lisa nodded. "I get that. But remember, Jesus didn't just talk about love; He showed it. He forgave everyone, even those who crucified Him."

Jesus came to live before us so we could know what God is like. John 1:14 says, *"And the Word was made (became) flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."* He said in John 14:9, *"...he that hath seen me hath seen the Father...."* Amazing words!

God wants you to have the same consciousness. He wants you to think and talk like Jesus. How much of the person and character of Jesus is expressed in and through you?

Ephesians 5:1-2 says, *"Be ye therefore followers of God, as dear children. And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice"*

to God for a sweetsmelling savour."

The only reason we can imitate God is because we've seen Him in Jesus Christ. Jesus came to unveil Him. For example, we often talk about how God loves us, but we couldn't describe that love until we saw Jesus in action. Now we can walk in love as Christ also loved us. Christ showed us how to practice God's love. Hallelujah!

LET'S TALK



Elena was a vibrant member of her church, dedicated to leading the youth. Over time, she grew weary and stopped serving. One day, she saw someone else thriving in her former role. She realized she'd forfeited her crown of righteousness by stepping back. Determined, she returned, holding fast to her work.

What a strong admonition from the Lord! He counselled the church in Philadelphia to hold fast to what they had. These weren't earthly things but spiritual things. He told them to hold fast to them because of the possibility of losing them. The way to hold fast to what God has given to you is to put it to work; keep using it.

If it weren't possible for someone else to get it, God wouldn't have said so. Read our opening verse again: "...hold that fast which thou hast, that no man take thy crown." Seeing someone else do what God told you to do is one of life's deepest pains. Think about Saul, for example; when God called Saul to be king of Israel, He promised him an eternal dynasty. Saul however lost it, and David got it (1 Samuel 13:13-14).

Whatever assignment is given to you to carry out in the house of God, hallow it. Do it joyfully and do it as

unto Christ. Handle it with great care because at the end of the day, the Bible says we'll all give account to God for all that we did. Also, there's a crown waiting, and it's a crown of righteousness for all who obeyed Him and fulfilled their assignment.

'And now he has made all of this plain to us by the appearing of Christ Jesus, our Savior. He broke the power of death and illuminated the way to life and immortality through the Good News.'

LET'S TALK

When I came across this verse years ago, for a second, I thought I didn't see it. "Did Paul actually say Jesus Christ abolished death?" I wondered. I studied the verse in-depth, looking in the original Greek and studying every word used. I found out after my study that the verse meant exactly what it said: Jesus Christ abolished death.

Some people try to reason it out and say Paul was referring to spiritual death. A thousand times, no! Observe from our opening verse that Jesus not only abolished death, He brought life and immortality to light. If the death was spiritual death, what about immortality? Could the Bible have meant spiritual immortality? That expression makes no sense; in fact, it's a contradiction. Thus, the reason Paul made reference to immortality is because he was talking about physical death.

Some people however get troubled by what the Bible says in 1 Corinthians 15:26: "The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death." So they say, "We still have death to deal with; it's the last enemy to be destroyed." No, that's not what the Scripture is saying and I'll explain.

It's like when the Bible says in the book of Revelation, "And I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, Now is come salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God..." (Revelation 12:10). The fact that the voice said "Now is come salvation" didn't mean everyone in the world was receiving

salvation for the first time. People had been saved before then.

So, when the Bible says death is the last enemy to be destroyed, it's talking about death as a spirit that would be cast into the lake of fire: *"And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death"* (Revelation 20:14). That's when death will be destroyed. But already, it has been overcome; the law of death has been abrogated. The Master didn't come from heaven for nothing. He didn't die for nothing. He came to abolish death and He achieved it! Blessed be God!

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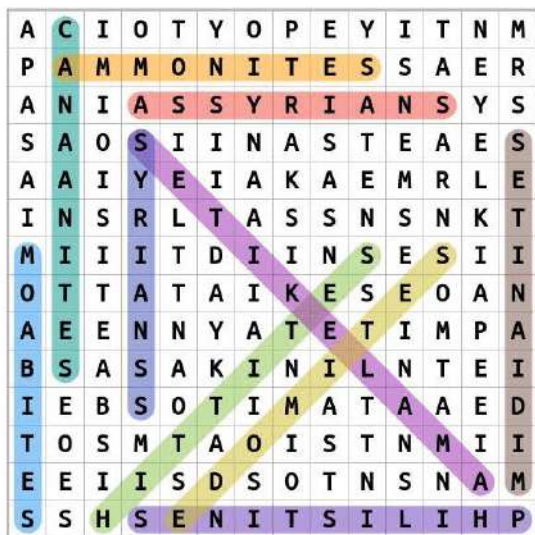
