TO THE BIBLE - Luke 22:29 NIV

"And I confer on you a kingdom, just as my Father conferred one on me."

LET'S TALK

A short while before His crucifixion, The Lord Jesus said something remarkable to His disciples. He acknowledged their faithfulness and unwavering support during His trials. Because of their steadfastness, He said, "...I confer on you a kingdom, just as my Father conferred one on me" (Luke 22:29 NIV).

Hebrews 12:28 gives more insight into this. It says, "Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear." At first glance, it might seem like this is a future promise, but that's not the case. It's written in the affirmative—it's a present reality!

The Complete Jewish Bible (CJB) makes this clear: "Therefore, since we have received an unshakeable kingdom...." We have received an unshakeable kingdom in this day and in this hour of our lives. Right now, you're living in it, exercising its authority, power, and influence.

This kingdom has extraordinary heritage, but many aren't aware of this. Even though you live in this world, you belong to a much greater one—the Kingdom of God. It's the reason you must know the life and modus operandi of the Kingdom of God to which you belong and superimpose

it on this natural world, which is the lesser world. You were sent to be a witness of the Kingdom to this natural world.

You are its voice, its messenger, and its expression. You're to show the world the reality of God's Kingdom and invite others to be part of it. You've been entrusted with the keys to bring them in. What an honor to be raised, empowered, and commissioned for this purpose. Hallelujah!

TO THE BIBLE - Romans 5:17 NIV

"For if, by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through that one man, how much more will those who receive God's abundant provision of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ."

LET'S TALK

Observe what Paul points out in the opening verse: we're to reign in life through Jesus Christ. Some people think this only applies to the future, but that's not true—it says in life, meaning right here, right now. It's not just something for later; it's for today!

From the resurrection of Jesus until the rapture of the Church, this is the time we reign through Him. This is the Church Age, the only period when we have the power to exercise authority through Jesus Christ. After this, we'll reign with Him but not through Him anymore. These two times—now and later—are different.

During the Millennium, when Jesus rules on earth, we'll reign with Him. After that, we'll keep reigning with Him forever. But right now, in this age, we reign through Him, using His Name to take authority and dominion over everything.

Understanding this truth gives you the confidence to live victoriously. You're not just someone waiting for the future—you're already a ruler and an heir with Christ. So don't sit back—take action! Assert your authority in Christ and manifest His Kingdom on earth. Seize the opportunity accorded to us in the Church Age to rule over Satan, the

forces and adversities of life. Demonstrate the power, love and righteousness of Christ in your world and spheres of influence.

Remember, you have your own world to impact, and you'll be held accountable for what you did with the Kingdom that's been conferred on you. So make sure you're using His Name to bring His Kingdom to your sphere of influence today!



In Colossians 1:26-27, Paul shows us another truth, "the mystery which has been hidden from ages and from generations, but now has been revealed to His saints. To them God willed to make known what are the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles: which is Christ in you, the hope of glory." While salvation is you in Christ, Christianity is Christ in you. It's Christ living in you and through you every day.

In Ephesians 5:30, Paul reminds us of something so profound: "For we are members of His body, of His flesh, and of His bones." This imagery reinforces the inextricable union we have with Christ. In 1 Corinthians 6:15, it says, "Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ?" That means your hands, feet, and voice are all empowered by Him. When you speak, it's Christ speaking through you. When you help or encourage others, it's Christ ministering through you.

The Lord Jesus Himself said in Luke 10:16, "He who

hears you hears Me." This is the incredible reality of having Christ in you. You're not just living your life—you are the embodiment of God's glory. Wherever you go, you carry His presence and radiate His glory. You have the privilege to be a conduit of His divine power!

If Moses, David, Isaiah, Job, King Solomon, Micah, or any of the prophets of old appeared today, what do you think they'd say to us? What about the apostles—Peter, Paul, James, or John? If they showed up to minister to you, what message would they share?

Here's the truth: they would say exactly what's already written in their books. Their writings are sealed, complete, and timeless. They wouldn't add or subtract a word because their ministry ended with those writings.

But with the Lord Jesus, it's completely different. His ministry didn't end with His death. He rose from the dead and continues His ministry to this very day. So, if the Lord Jesus were to appear to you now, He could say something new, but it would always align with His Word. His words possess an eternal relevance that transcends time and circumstances.

In John 16:12-15, He said, "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth... He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you."


(Acknowledge Christ As Your Wisdom)

TO THE BIBLE - 1 Corinthians 1:30 KJV

"But of him are ye in Christ Jesus, who of God is made unto us wisdom, and righteousness, and sanctification, and redemption."

LET'S TALK



Our opening scripture says, "...Christ Jesus, who of God is made unto us wisdom..." (1 Corinthians 1:30 KJV). Think about that. Christ Himself has been made your wisdom. This means you don't need to ask God for wisdom anymore because wisdom is already inside you. It brings to mind what Paul said in Colossians 1:27 KJV, "...Christ in you, the hope of glory." When Christ came into your life, He brought His glory and His wisdom with Him.

Have you ever encountered individuals who don't reason soundly or correctly? During a discussion, their responses leave you bewildered, their thought pattern reeks of thoughtlessness; it's like foolishness on rampage. Sadly, they're oblivious to their own lack of insight. When prompted to express themselves publicly, for example, their utterances become disconcerting. This is because wisdom eludes them.

Wisdom is your birthright as a child of God. This is why you can't settle for confusion or poor judgment. But

for it to work in your life, you must acknowledge it. Divine wisdom enables you to make sound decisions, communicate clearly, and approach life's challenges with confidence. You become discerning, insightful, and excellent in all you do.

So as you go along this year, let your actions and words reflect this acknowledgment. Whatever task is before you, declare that you'll produce excellence because Christ is your wisdom. With Him, you'll shine brightly and show the world what it means to walk in divine insight!

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

Just as you no longer need to ask God for wisdom (because He's already made Christ our wisdom), you don't need to beg for blessings or favor. Remember what we read in our opening scripture, Philemon 1:6 KJV, "That the communication of thy faith may become effectual by the acknowledging of every good thing which is in you in Christ Jesus." What God expects is for you


DON'T LEAVE THEM BY THEMSELVES

Salvation is only the starting point. New converts need to understand that they have to grow and mature spiritually, and that growth comes by learning God's Word. The Bible says in 1 Timothy 3:15, "...the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth." So, the Church is the place to learn the Word of God.

Just like babies need milk to grow, new converts need the Word of God. As 1 Peter 2:2 KJV says, "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby." 

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FACTS ABOUT MUSIC



ately, there's been a subtle but dangerous idea orchestrated by Satan—that you don't need to be part of a church to serve God. This is a deceptive strategy to pull Christians away from the support and systems God designed for families.

Think about it: In God's design, children are placed under guardians and teachers until they mature. The Bible says in Galatians 4:1-2 KJV, "Now I say, That the heir, as long as he is a child...is under tutors and governors until the time appointed of the father." The same principle applies spiritually. God created the church as a family where you're guided, strengthened, and protected in your faith. Walking away from that covering leaves you vulnerable to attacks, discouragement, and confusion.

Some people believe that simply watching sermons online or hopping between churches is enough. But that's not God's design. Church isn't just about attending—it's about belonging. A strong, committed church family provides spiritual stability, accountability, and a place to grow in your Christian Walk. That's why Hebrews 10:25 warns us, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves

together, as is the manner of some..."

King David understood this when he said, "I was glad when they said to me, let us go into the house of the Lord." (Psalm 122:1). He recognized the joy and blessing of being planted in God's house. So don't fall for the lie that church doesn't matter. Stay connected, stay committed, and encourage others to do the same. You're meant to thrive in the family of God!

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MINISTERS OF RECONCILIATION

(We Bear Witness Of The Truth)

TO THE BIBLE - Romans 5:10

"For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life."

LET'S TALK



In Ephesians 4:11-12 KJV, the Bible tells us that God "...gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ." These five ministry gifts exist to equip Christians and build up the Church. But what exactly is "the work of the ministry"?

As a Christian, you have two main areas of ministry: one is within the Church—building up fellow believers—and the other is your primary calling: the ministry of reconciliation.

2 Corinthians 5:18 makes this clear: "And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation." If you're in Christ, then God has entrusted you with this ministry—to bring others into a relationship with Him.

Verse 19 explains it even further: "That God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation." This means God is not holding people's sins against them; instead, He has made a way for them to be saved through Jesus. And now, He has given us the responsibility of sharing this truth with the world.

In Acts 1:8 KJV, the Lord Jesus said, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you:

and ye shall be witnesses unto me..." This is not just for pastors or evangelists—it's for every Christian. Mark 16:15 says, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." That's your assignment!

You are God's representative, called to share His love and truth with those around you. It's not just a suggestion; it's a mandate. So step out boldly and be the light that brings others to Christ.


(Let The World Know About God's Overwhelming Love And Grace)

TO THE BIBLE - 2 Corinthians 5:19 KJV

"To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation."

LET'S TALK



(not just Christians) back to Himself, not counting their sins against them. That's incredible!

Many people don't realize that Jesus was actually God in human form, taking the place of sinful humanity on the Cross. He endured the worst pain and punishment—out of pure love for man.

The prophet Isaiah described Him in Isaiah 53:2-3, saying that Jesus didn't come with flashy looks or royal status. There was nothing about His appearance that made people admire Him. Instead, He was rejected, looked down on, and ignored.

But the world didn't recognize Him. The Creator of the universe—the One who made every person—was the one suffering for them, yet they didn't see it. That's why He sent us to proclaim His love. Jesus is the embodiment of God's love. He was sent to reconcile humanity back to God, not to condemn them. Even the worst sinner is loved by Him. He holds no grudges, no resentment—only love.

The Bible says that God is not willing that any should

perish but that all should come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9). That's why we have this mandate: to tell the world about Jesus, to declare His love, and to let them know the worth of His sacrifice. It's up to us to share this message of love and grace!



LET'S TALK

t's very easy for the natural man or someone who isn't learned in the things of God to think being born again is a mere religious cliché. Some even think being born again means to turn over a new leaf or make new resolutions to be a better person. No! It's way more than that!

Being born again isn't necessarily about outward expressions or experiencing something. Quite the contrary, you are the experience. In that very moment you happened. Think of it like when a baby is born. No one says, "Wow, that baby just had an experience." No—the baby itself is the experience! In the same way, when you got born again, you happened.

Being born again means your past is completely erased. The old "you" died in Christ, and the new "you" has the resurrection life. It's not the same person that died in Christ that's alive now. That's why 2 Corinthians 5:17 says, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away, and all things have become new."

So, from the moment you're born again, you're like a newborn in God's eyes, ready to grow and learn. That's why 1 Peter 2:2 KJV says, "Like newborn babies, crave pure

spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow." The more you learn from God's Word, the more you grow into the person He created you to be. You're not just turning over a new leaf—you've started a completely new life in Christ!





LET'S TALK



His grandmother chuckled. "Who told you we age in Christ?"

He raised an eyebrow. "Isn't that how life works?"

She smiled knowingly. "Not exactly. You see, in Christ, we don't just count years and age—we live in eternal life."

The Bible shows us the body can hold out for long. Adam lived for 930 years before he died. He didn't die because the body couldn't take it anymore; he died because of sin. God had said to him, "But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die." (Genesis 2:17). He ate of it and died. Many others lived for several hundreds of years. Some even lived older than Adam until the sin in the world got so much and God said, "...My Spirit shall not strive with man forever, for he is indeed flesh; yet his days shall be one hundred and twenty years." (Genesis 6:3). Notice that God didn't say less than 120 years. Some people however quote Psalm 90 and say God reduced the number of years of man's life from 120 to 70. But that's incorrect. That particular Psalm wasn't written by David; it

was a lamentation written by Moses. It says, "The days of our lives are seventy years; and if by reason of strength they are eighty years..." (Psalm 90:10). Moses wasn't stating something from God; he saw the children of Israel passing away at a young age and he lamented. Think about it: how long did Moses himself live? "Moses was one hundred and twenty years old when he died. His eyes were not dim nor his natural vigor diminished" (Deuteronomy 34:7 NKJV). If Moses could have had such an amazing testimony, you have something better. In Christ, you've been brought into agelessness. When you were born again, you received the same eternal life as Jesus. Eternal life is the life with agelessness. When you received it, you were brought into God's realm of eternity, into an ageless zone. In Christ, we grow without ageing; we have an endless, incorruptible, and indestructible life.

TO THE BIBLE - 2 Corinthians 5:19 NLT

"For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, no longer counting people's sins against them. And he gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation."

LET'S TALK

Lena always felt unworthy of God's love. Every Lenistake weighed on her, making her believe she could never be accepted. One day, she read Colossians 1:22—"Now He has reconciled you... to present you holy and blameless."

Tears filled her eyes as she realized—Jesus already made her righteous! She didn't have to earn it; it was a gift. From that day, Lena stopped living in guilt. She walked in confidence, sharing with others that Christ had justified them too.

The past no longer defined her—she was free, holy, and blameless before God! Hallelujah!

Jesus came to reconcile the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses against them. Christ Jesus initiated and established peace between God and man through His death on the cross. Man had become alienated from the life of God through Adam's disobedience, but Jesus reconciled us with the Father in the body of His flesh through death, to present us holy, blameless and above reproach before the Father.

Now, who is Jesus, and why was He able to achieve this for man? Was He just a good man? No; otherwise, He wouldn't have qualified to die for us because the Bible says that all have sinned and come short of the glory of God. The blood of the ordinary man wouldn't qualify for our redemption. But the blood of Jesus was divine, being God in the flesh. He was sinless. The Bible says, ""Therefore let it be known to you, brethren, that through this Man is preached to

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you the forgiveness of sins; and by Him everyone who believes is justified from all things from which you could not be justified by the law of Moses." (Acts 13:38-39). Notice that the Scriptures didn't say "shall be justified"; it's not a promise. Everyone who believes is justified. The resurrection of Jesus Christ by which you were recreated with a new life of righteousness qualified you to live in the presence of God without guilt or condemnation; you're free from all accusations, being justified by His grace. This is the Gospel!

The reason you're holy, blameless and justified before the Father isn't because of what you did or didn't do; it's the result of what Jesus did and who He is. Now you have received abundance of grace and the gift of righteousness in Christ

Jesus. Hallelujah!



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BE ZEALOUS FOR CHRIST

(Live a Life The Lord Approves of)

TO THE BIBLE - Revelation 3:15-17 NIV

"So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth. You say, 'I am rich; I have acquired wealth and do not need a thing."

LET'S TALK

Jason's friends often invited him to join them for soul winning and cell meetings, but he always shrugged it off. "I'm a Christian," he would say, "but I don't have to be extreme about it." He preferred to keep his faith personal—just enough to believe but not enough to stand out.

One day, his friend David challenged him. "Jason, why are you so passive about your faith? Jesus gave everything for us."

Jason frowned. "I'm just not the 'fire and zeal' type," he replied.

David sighed. "Being lukewarm isn't an option. Jesus said He'd rather we be hot or cold. But if we're lukewarm, He'll spit us out."

To be lukewarm means to be cold, expressionless, inactive, or passive. That's like some people today who say, "Yes, I'm a Christian, but I'm not so into it. I keep my Christianity quiet and calm. I'm moderate." But Jesus said to the Laodiceans, "And to the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write, 'These things says the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God: "I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot. So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth" (Revelation 3:14-16). In other words, He found them disgusting and was about to vomit them out. Sadly, the people didn't know this. They didn't know that

time they gathered together, the Master stayed outside and didn't enter their church. That's why He said, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock..." (Revelation 3:20). He was supposed to be inside, but He was disgusted. Jesus admonished the Laodiceans not to trust in their riches but to be zealous "As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten. Therefore be zealous and repent." (Revelation 3:19). To be zealous means to be afire or be hot with zeal. He doesn't want you cold or lukewarm. In fact, He commands you to be zealous. It's better to be zealous than to be lukewarm. How zealous can you be for Jesus to say: "It's enough?" It will only be enough when we get to heaven. Don't let anyone deceive you and tell you you're doing too much for God. Be your best and live your best for Him.

LET'S TALK



Our opening scripture reveals something amazing—God has lavishly given us every kind of wisdom in Christ Jesus! The Amplified Classic version of verse 8 says, "Which He lavished upon us in every kind of wisdom and understanding (practical insight and prudence)." Take a moment to let that sink in.

Now, think about what the Lord Jesus said in Matthew 12:42: "The queen of the South will rise up in the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon; and indeed a greater than Solomon is here."

Solomon had incredible wisdom, and from the Greek Septuagint we see this wisdom was Phronesis. Luke 1:17 calls it "the wisdom of the just." But here's the best part—this wisdom isn't just for Solomon or the prophets. It's available to you in Christ!

Phronesis" means practical wisdom, and in Christ, it's available to you! The Bible says Christ has been made unto you wisdom from God. This wisdom helps us make wise choices, solve problems, and excel in whatever you dowhether in school, sports, business, science, or any career.

God's wisdom isn't just mere knowledge; it's a spiritual elixir that guides you in the perfect will of God, causing you to be at the right place, at the right time, and for the right purpose. It also shapes how you think, helping you say the right things at the right time in the right way. With this wisdom, you stand out and shine for God. Hallelujah!



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"HIKANOTĒS"

"Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think any thing as of ourselves; but our sufficiency is of God." (2 Corinthians 3:5)

Hikanotēs is derived from the Greek word hikanos, meaning sufficient, competent, or qualified. Sufficiency is a fundamental concept in Christian faith, rooted in the understanding that all ability, competence, and qualification come from God.

This word appears in 2 Corinthians 3:5, "Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think any thing as of ourselves; but our sufficiency is of God."

The idea of divine sufficiency permeates Scripture, emphasizing that a Christian's ability is God-given. Another passage reinforcing this truth is 2 Corinthians 9:8: "And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work." Here, the word "sufficiency" comes from autarkeia, meaning self-sufficiency—not in isolation from God but as a state of being fully resourced by Him. This aligns with Hikanotēs, further emphasizing that God has made Christians completely adequate for their calling and purpose.

Hikanotēs is that divine competence that supersedes human limitations. Many individuals struggle with self-doubt, believing that their skills, intelligence, or resources are insufficient for the tasks before them. However, Christian sufficiency does not originate from personal effort but from God's supernatural enablement. Live daily with the consciousness of Hikanotēs—because your sufficiency is of God!

LET'S TALK

As Jake and Mia walked home from school, Jake let out a sigh. "I feel so average," he muttered. "Some people just seem to shine naturally, like they were born to stand out."

Mia glanced at him and smiled. "You were made to shine," she said. "Jesus said, 'You are the light of the world."

Jake raised an eyebrow. "Okay, but how? I don't exactly feel like I'm glowing."

Mia chuckled. "The more you know God, the brighter you shine. His Word fills you with wisdom, confidence, and glory."

The Bible says in Matthew 5:14-16, "You are the light of the world...Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." That means your life is supposed to stand out, to be a reflection of God's glory. But how bright you shine is up to you.

Isaiah 60:1 says, "Arise, shine; For your light has come! And the glory of the Lord is risen upon you." God's glory isn't just some far-off, unreachable thing—it's in you! The more you know God—through His Word, the more the glory in your life increases and your efficiency, effectiveness and results multiply; your spirit is continually renewed, refreshed and polished. Colossians 3:16 says, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly..." Fill yourself with His Word, and watch your life transform. So, how brightly do you want to shine? That's up to you.

LET'S TALK

Run with the mindset of victory. Paul himself set this example. Remember part of his valedictory admonition in 2 Timothy 4:5 KJV; he said, "... Watch thou in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, make full proof of thy ministry."

Paul could say this with confidence because he lived it out. He stayed focused, completed his mission, and at the end of his journey he gloriously testified: "For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand.

I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing" (2 Timothy 4:6-8 KJV).

Your life isn't random— you're on a journey with a profound purpose. Keep this truth constantly before you, and it'll serve as a guiding light in the way you live your life. Hallelujah!

LET'S TALK



"Did Jesus really say He was God?" Jake asked, doubtful.

"Absolutely!" Sarah replied as she searched quickly through her Bible. "See how He responded when asked if He was the Christ; He said, "Yes, I am, and you'll see it yourself: the Son of Man seated at the right hand of the Mighty One, arriving on the clouds of heaven" Mark 14:62 (MSG).

Jake frowned. "But why did that make the Jewish religious leaders so angry?"

"Because to the Jews, calling yourself the Son of God meant you were claiming to be God in the flesh," Sarah explained.

Jake's eyes widened. "So, Jesus wasn't just a prophet?" Sarah smiled. "Exactly! He was God in the flesh, walking among men."

Many Christians haven't fully grasped what the expression "Jesus the Christ" really means? The word "Christ" was translated from the Greek language into English, and it doesn't properly capture the Jewish concept of "The Messiah." This is understandable because the Greeks didn't have the message of the Kingdom. But the Jews knew that the word "Christ" meant far more than "the Anointed One"; it actually means "God in the flesh."

This claim, which many take so lightly, was what they

killed Jesus for. He claimed to be "the Christ, the Son of God," meaning that He was God's manifestation in the flesh. And He was right. Consequently, He was condemned to death. They accused Him of robbing God of His place. They said, "... For a good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy, and because You, being a Man, make Yourself God." (John 10:33). But the Bible says, "Who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God." (Philippians 2:6), because He is Himself God. 1 Timothy 3:16 says, "...God was manifested in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached among the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory." That's Jesus, the Christ. Glory, Hallelujah!

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WISDOM IN RIGHTEOUS LIVING

(The Three Types of Wisdom: Sophia, Sunesis, and Phronesis)

Sunday 27

TO THE BIBLE - James 4:17 NIV

"If anyone, then, knows the good they ought to do and doesn't do it, it is sin for them."

LET'S TALK

John's friends laughed as he hesitated. They dared him to sneak into the amusement park without a ticket.

"Come on, don't be scared!" one of them teased.

John knew it was wrong. "Nah, I'm good," he said, stepping back. "I'd rather do the right thing." His friends groaned but moved on.

Wisdom gives you the ability to decide and discern right from wrong. Wisdom helps you distinguish righteousness from evil. There're three major kinds of wisdom the Word of God talks about, and the Greek words for them are "Sophia," "Sunesis" and "Phronesis."

"Sophia" is theoretical wisdom, the insight that God gives you into reality. "Sunesis" is comprehension, perception, understanding, the ability to understand concepts and see relationships between them. It suggests quickness of apprehension, the penetrating consideration which precedes action.

But when we say wisdom is the ability to decide and discern right from wrong, we're referring to "Phronesis," which is practical wisdom. "Phronesis" is a mindset, the mindset of the righteous; it's a force. When we say wisdom is a force, we're referring to "Phronesis."

"Phronesis" is that disposition of being in the will of God beyond your reasoning. It's a special spiritual elixir that locates you within the framework or ambits of God's will beyond your understanding. It locates you in the places where you ought to be; it causes you to do the things you ought to do without having to reason them out first because it has created a mindset within your system. It's your default setting to only talk right, think right, live right, and do right. It's a programming. If therefore you know what is right by "Sophia" and you don't do it, then it means you lack "Phronesis." "Phronesis" is a propeller. It helps you see what you should see that others may not see. The beautiful thing is, you can develop yourself to function always in "Phronesis" through conscious and constant meditation on the Word of God.

If you like, sing it and "shake" and think you're being blessed; you're not. The Bible doesn't say anything about "Pentecostal power"; there's no such thing as Pentecostal power. But a good number of Christians sing such songs because it makes them "feel good." Feeling good and being blessed aren't the same. They dance until they're drenched in sweat, thinking they're praising God. Such dancing in the flesh may make you feel good; it doesn't mean you're blessed and that God accepts it.

True worship is of the spirit and in the spirit, not in the flesh. Recall what we read in our theme verse. It parallels the words of the Lord Jesus in John 4:23 KJV, "But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him." Notice the Master didn't say, "The Father

seeks those who will dance with all their might and sweat on the dance floor." True worship is done according to the Word of God and by the Holy Spirit.

So, when you praise God, let your heart be attuned to Him. Offer to Him words that glorify His Name—words that are consistent with His person, His character and love, His grace, tender-mercies, holiness, righteousness and greatness. That's what blesses you and brings transformation to your life.

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


